

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

July 22, 2019

The Council of the Village of Coldwater held its regular meeting in the Village Council Chambers on July 22, 2019, with Mayor Joe Knapschaefer presiding. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM.

Roll call was responded to by: Branch, Schwieterman, Ahrens, Brunswick and James. Bertke was absent.

Invocation by Brunswick.

A motion was made by Branch, second by Schwieterman to approve the minutes from the July 8, 2019 regular meeting. Roll call resulted in the following ayes: Branch, Schwieterman, Ahrens and James. Brunswick abstained. Motion Carried.

Comments from the Public: A group of concerned neighbors near 608 Eden Avenue inquired about their rights as property owners. The property in question has long grass, weeds, a junk vehicle and a fence that is in bad shape. The group was advised by Knapschaefer to contact the police department about the long grass and the junk vehicle. They were also advised to report any rodent sightings to the Village so the health department can get involved.

Ordinance 1687: An ordinance adopting subdivision regulations for The Village of Coldwater received its first reading.


Council Call-Final Comments:
