

## RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

September 27, 2021

The Council of the Village of Coldwater held its regular meeting in the Village Council Chambers on September 27, 2021, with Mayor Doug Bertke presiding. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM.

Roll call was responded to by: Buschur, Siefring, Schwieterman, Bettinger, Rutschilling and Brunswick.

Invocation by Bettinger.

Guests included Jim Stelzer and Georgia Rindler.

A motion was made by Schwieterman, second by Buschur to approve the minutes from September 13, 2021. Roll call resulted in the following ayes: Buschur, Siefring, Schwieterman, Bettinger, Rutschilling and Brunswick. Motion Carried.

A motion was made by Siefring, second by Rutschilling to approve the agenda. Roll call resulted in the following ayes: Buschur, Siefring, Schwieterman, Bettinger, Rutschilling and Brunswick. Motion Carried.

Reports:

Police: None

Finance Director: Eyink reported that he attended the GFOA (Government Finance Officers Association) last week. He earned 9 hours of training credit for the Ohio Auditor Fiscal Integrity Act. He reported that the Village recently sold a 2003 Ford Van for \$2325, a 1989 Chevy 3500 Truck for \$3175 and a 2014 Dodge Charger for \$5150. All of these vehicles were sold on PublicSurplus.com.

Village Manager: Thomas said Shelley Company will be in town the week of October 11 to do the grinding and grading for the 2021 street project.

Mayor: Mayor Bertke read the official proclamation from the Ohio Secretary of State regarding the census of 2020. The Village of Coldwater now has a population of 4774 residents.

New Business:

Ordinance 1703: An ordinance establishing certain positions and a pay schedule for hourly and salaried employees of the Village of Coldwater; providing for employee benefits not otherwise specified in the personnel policies manual, repealing all ordinances inconsistent herewith and declaring an effective date. Ordinance 1703 received its first reading.

Ordinance 1704: An ordinance authorizing the sale of 34.821 acres in Butler Township, Mercer County, Ohio and declaring an effective date. Ordinance 1704 received its first reading.

Council Call-Final Comments:

Schwieterman discussed the recent Mercer County EMS meeting. He said there are currently 6 people studying to be EMT's. He also said the county recently purchased a new power cot for about \$48,000.

Rutschilling asked about the May property on Second Street. Thomas said May has cleaned up the outside some, and that he is intending to sell the property.


